The EMERGE study (Effect of COVID-19 and government restriction on the sexual health and well-being of gay and bisexual men in Ireland)

Why is this study being done?

The COVID-19 crisis has had a huge impact and affected almost every area of life in the countries which have been worst hit. This includes disruption to health care services, restrictions on socialising, closing parts of the economy, job losses and limits on sexual relationships.

Gay, bisexual and other men who have sex with men may be at greater risk of poor health and well-being outcomes related to the COVID-19 crisis and government restrictions.

Understanding the scale of these impacts, and which groups of gay, bisexual and other men who have sex with men are most affected is really important in designing responses which will help in recovery efforts.

Please take part if you are...

- a man (cis or trans) who has sex with men (cis or trans)
- or a man (cis or trans) who is attracted to other men (cis or trans)
- or a man (cis or trans) who thinks he might have sex with men (cis or trans) in the future.
- and are aged 18 years or older
- have lived in the Republic of Ireland at some point between March 2020 and now

What is it about?

This survey asks about your well-being during the COVID-19 crisis. This includes details on the sex you have been having, your alcohol and other substance use, your mental health, your use of health services and your employment situation.

How long will it take?

Most people will take around 10 minutes to complete this survey. Please make sure you have enough time and battery power, because you cannot come back to complete it if you log off.

Why should I take part?

Gay, bisexual and other men who have sex with men can face unique challenges related to their well-being. These include mental health struggles, alcohol and substance use, issues relating to employment and higher rates of HIV and STI transmission. Sharing your experiences with us will help social and sexual health services better plan recovery efforts as the COVID-19 crisis recedes.

Although there will be no direct benefit to you from the information you provide, it will help health and social services to better meet the community's needs. It could also mean that services for gay and bisexual men are better funded and that more targeted support gets to those in the community who need it.

Who is running it?

The survey is being run by Sigma Research at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine (LSHTM) in the UK in partnership with MPOWER at HIV Ireland. This research has been approved by the ethics committee of the LSHTM and the Irish College of General Practitioners.

It has been developed with an Irish and UK based group of researchers and health workers in public health, academia, non-governmental organisations and clinical services working in sexual health and well-being for gay and bisexual men.

The survey is funded by the MPOWER Programme at HIV Ireland.

What about data protection?

We will **not** collect the TC/IP address of your device or try to install any cookies on it. We will **not** collect any information about you that would allow anybody to identify you. This means you need to complete the survey in one session and you cannot log out and return later. Participation is voluntary and you can withdraw at any time.

Where will the data go?

During recruitment, the survey software used will store anonymous responses on its servers which are located in the EU. Following recruitment completion anonymous survey data will be securely downloaded and stored on servers at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine in the UK. Only researchers working on this project will have access to the data during the project. Anonymous data from write-in questions will be securely transferred to HIV Ireland for analysis in Dublin. This will be done through an encrypted, password protected data transfer platform. All data will be held until our analysis and dissemination is done (probably about 1 year) and then submitted to the Irish Social Science Data Archive for preservation, with access controlled by HIV Ireland. At this time it will be erased from all other servers.

The dataset will be completely anonymous, and participants will not be identifiable.

When can I see the results?

Results will available by autumn of 2021. A community report will be available on the MPOWER website (MPOWER.HIVIreland.ie). Any journal articles we write will also be linked to there.

What if I have questions?

If you have questions about the survey or want to speak to the researcher team before deciding whether to take park, you can email Charles Witzel at Charles.Witzel@Ishtm.ac.uk. Charles is also the data controller.

What if I want to withdraw?

The survey is voluntary and you can stop and withdraw at any time while you are completing the survey. None of the data you supplied will be collected if you do this. Because it is an anonymous survey, it is not possible to withdraw after you have completed it as we will not be able to identify your specific response.
